This photo might not look much but it's meaningful to me. It's a view of the River Tiber in Ostia, about 20 miles from Rome. It was the focus of a previous sabbatical which began with a week in that beautiful city.



In his book Confessions, St. Augustine of Hippo describes looking out of a window of a house in Ostia on the River Tiber where he and his mother St. Monica shared a profound spiritual experience. His account of this experience was a reading I studied in a module on Christian Mysticism some years ago. It inspired me to go to Ostia which was a wonderful, spiritual and historical visit.

Confessions was written as a prayer to God and in it, Augustine uses his own life story to show how the more we learn about ourselves, the more we learn about God.

Nowadays ancient Ostia is an excavation site with buildings, frescoes and mosaics which have been excellently preserved. There is even an old, excavated church which would have stood during the time of Augustine's visit to the town. It was a sacred place for me.

Rome was the starting point of a journey made by another famous St. Augustine – of Canterbury. He was sent by Pope Gregory as a missionary to England and is regarded as the founder of the English Church. The site of the Benedictine monastery where this Augustine was the Prior now has a church dedicated to Pope Gregory. It was another significant sacred site in the history of Christianity which I was able to visit.

Journeys, pilgrimages and visits can be spiritual experiences in which we learn more about ourselves and about God. We can learn much about God's world through the geography and history of the places around us.

I hope that whatever you are doing for the remainder of this summer, whether it is a time of work, rest or play, whether you visit sacred sites, the seaside, or the local park, it will be a time of blessing and renewal.
